Sydney at that time, was also an open prison for the many convicts sent from the UK.

Caroline realised that life was not fair for either the new settlers or the convicts and set about trying to bring fairness to their lives.

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There were many ways in which she demonstrated kindness. They included her welcoming new arrivals on the quayside and giving practical advice on employment and accommodation.

Her kind efforts were duly recognised, and her image appeared on the Australian \$5 note for many years.
