





Charlotte Brontë and her sisters, Emily and Anne, were born in Yorkshire, UK in the early 19th century.

They came from a family of limited means, and were expected to marry well, to ensure their future.





The sisters had other ideas, and started to write. Initially, they had to publish under a pseudonym as it wasn't seen as 'proper' for women to be writers.

Charlotte Brontë wrote a novel called *Jane Eyre*. It was a huge success and shortly after its release, she revealed her true identity.

Over the years, she was outspoken about causes she saw as unjust and urged tolerance.



"Prejudices, it is well known, are most difficult to eradicate from the heart whose soil has never been loosened or fertilised by education; they grow firm there, firm as weeds among stones."
