A message from Mr Tucker

As we approach the halfway point of the last half term of 2021, it has been fantastic to see the number of students walking around the Academy with 100% attendance badges. These have been earned from having 100% attendance in the first half term and were awarded to them in the celebration assemblies. The same thing will happen this half term along with another attendance event similar to our 100% summer party at the end of last year. Students have been told that to gain entry they must have 100% attendance, no excuses, no exceptions.

It seems that our messages around the importance of attendance are having an effect as we still have some of the best attendance of all secondary schools in the city. It is also coming through as a strong area in the parental survey that has recently gone out and I want to thank all parents who have provided such positive feedback through this. We really do take the survey seriously and I am grateful to all those who have filled it in with such positive comments as well as constructive areas that we can improve on further. Some feedback has noted that sometimes communication does not get through and I would ask all parents to regularly check that we have correct contact details. The best way to do this is through the Parent Portal App where you can update this information live. We often find that where communication has failed it is because we hold incorrect e-mails and mobile numbers. Your support with this would allow us to ensure that communication always gets through.

I also want to raise the importance of homework. We have recently launched our new homework strategy which for Year 7,8 and 9 is built on their new Knowledge Organisers. Guidance for the use of these can be found on our website and it is important that students are supported at home to find both the time and space to complete the work set. After attendance, ensuring that children are encouraged and supported at home to do this independent study is so important if a child is to reach their full potential. I know that many parents work hard to establish this culture in the household and the school can support and offer guidance if this is a challenge. 
