




At Castle View Academy we expect you to look smart and wear the correct uniform from day one.




Uniform incudes wearing the correct PE kit which must be brought into school on the days you have PE/Dance.




You will also take part in dance lessons.


SCHOOL MAP

SUBJECTS AT CVA

ENGLISH

English at Castle View Academy is a chance for students to nurture their skills as critics and writers. Pupils will have the opportunity to enjoy different genres through a range of texts in the form of prose, plays and poetry. Additionally, English allows students to think creatively and craft their use of language which will guide them through school and later life.

Pupils will master writing analytically and creatively, producing critical essays, stories and non-fiction writing. The English Department will support them in learning how to communicate effectively and confidently when expressing their views and opinions.

English is an important subject for learners to become active in the classroom, gaining confidence and engaging with language in order for it to be used in a meaningful way.

MATHS


During your 5 years learning Maths at Castle View Academy, you'll learn all kinds of exciting and imaginative Mathematics that has changed the world. From understanding algebraic functions which are the backbone of computers and phones, to statistics that have revolutionised medicine and healthcare and saved countless lives. You will also learn all about ratio and proportion, how to accurately construct angles and shapes, trigonometry, how to manipulate negative numbers in ways you've never seen before as well as many other interesting topics. True Mathematicians will also get the chance to gain an extra GCSE at the end of year 11 by completing the Further Maths curriculum. This is an extra course, run alongside your normal GCSEs, for those students who have a real interest in Maths and want a head start in A Level Maths.



SCIENCE

In Year 7 you will learn about:

- **Particles**: building on your KS2 knowledge of solids, liquids and gasses.
- **Cells**: plant, animal and bacteria cells. Using microscopes to view cells.
- **Energy**: Extending your knowledge on energy stores, transfers and conservation of energy.
- Reproduction
- Chemical reactions: you will be introduced to the pH scale, acids, alkalis and neutralisation.
- Forces: you will explore the relationship between energy and forces.





In Key Stage 3, as you continue or start your Spanish language journey, you'll dive even deeper into the exciting world of Español! You'll build on popular Spanish phrases, like basic greetings and simple sentences, and start crafting more complex conversations.

You'll explore Spanish culture through learning about delicious food, vibrant music, and colorful festivals. You'll also learn about famous Spanish-speaking people and places. Don't be surprised if you find yourself dancing to some catchy Spanish songs or thinking about a delicious paella in class.

Learning Spanish in KS3 will not only help you communicate with millions of people around the world but also give you a passport to a whole new world of adventure and discovery. ¡Vamos! (Let's go!)

HISTORY



The History department at CVA offers a curriculum that spans a wide range of historical periods and topics:

- Beginning in Year 7, students embark on a journey through time, commencing with the year 1000 and progressing through Medieval History.
- Year 8 delves into the Reformation and journeys through the rise and fall of the British Empire.
- In Year 9, the focus shifts to the tumultuous 20th century, starting with WWI and culminating in an exploration of the Cold War.

GEOGRAPHY

Geography allows you to experience the world. In Geography you will study:

- Human geography to understand how the Earth is shaped and influenced by people, this will be through looking at the development of countries, population structures, urban issues in the UK and life in an emerging country.
- Physical topics will give you an understanding of how the earth works, topics include rivers and coasts, climate change and natural hazards (earthquakes, volcanoes, and tropical storms).



ETHICS

Ethics will give you a great understanding of the world and the people who live in it. You will study a variety of religions including Christianity, Judaism, Islam as well as the philosophy of religion. You will also study ethical topics and can debate issues such as capital punishment, war, and human rights. Ethics will prepare you for a life in a multi-cultural world.

ART



Explore the world of Art and Design throughout your key stage three experience where you will study the art work of local and well known artists, research and explore different art techniques and create a range of personal responses whilst exploring your own ideas.

DESIGN & TECHNOLOGY

Design and Technology is an inspiring, rigorous and practical subject. Using creativity and imagination, pupils design and make products that solve real and relevant problems within a variety of contexts, considering their own and others' needs, wants and values. They acquire a broad range of subject knowledge and draw on disciplines such as mathematics, science, engineering, computing and art. Pupils learn how to take risks, becoming resourceful, innovative, enterprising and capable citizens. Through the evaluation of past and present design and technology, they develop a critical understanding of its impact on daily life and the wider world. High-quality design and technology education makes an essential contribution to the creativity, culture, wealth and well-being of the nation.

FOOD TECHNOLOGY

Explore the world of Food Preparation & Nutrition from Year 8 where you will study the impact of good nutrition on the mind and body. You will be taught professional cutting techniques and heat control, when making a variety of both hot and cold dishes, each one meeting the needs of a specific design brief.

Working with different methods of heat, we will also explore the effect each will have on a variety of products. From fruit salad and coleslaw, to delicious baked goods, enjoy a whistle-stop tour guaranteed to tantalise, tease and tickle your taste-buds!

MUSIC



Music is a phenomenally creative subject which is experienced by all students at Castle View Academy. They will learn to play piano, drums, guitar, bass, ukulele, singing and Djembes to name but a few. They will learn to play as parts of a band as well as learn how to use their own body as an instrument. Headline figures for music at GCSE are 100% 4+ grades and 45% 7+ grades.

MEDIA

If you like working with computers and designing posters, game covers, dvds and magazines, then this is the subject for you!

Media Studies is based primarily on the IMacs using specialist design programmes whilst exploring the world of film and production.



DRAMA




Drama is an exciting subject in which students get to express themselves whilst exploring the acting world as a performer, director and critic. In key stage three they will study; key drama techinques such as freeze frames, mime, thought tracking, use of props, theatre in education etc as well as studying professional works such as Matilda and Harry Potter and the Cursed Child. Drama students have the opportunity to perform in our Winter Showcases, Pantomimes and Musicals if they wish to audition.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Come down to see our wonderful sports hall where you will be able to see our fantastic facility with a range of activities being show cased. In PE at CVA our curriculum is fun, varied and engaging for all. During your time at CVA you will participate in sports such as badminton, volleyball, football, rugby, tennis, gymnastics, basketball as well as inter house sports competitions.





DANCE

Dance is a creative and exciting subject taught to all students in key stage three by a specialist dance teacher. They will cover a range of different dance styles and techniques and explore professional works, whilst becoming performers, choreographers and critics. Regular trips are run to local theatres, dance competitions and this year we have a performance team who will be travelling to Disney Land Paris to dance. Dance is a hugely successful option subject at key stage 4 with headline results including 100% 4+ grades and 50% level 7+ grades.
